Tell us about yourself:

I am a sinner saved by grace, redeemed through the love, life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. That truth anchors everything I do. Every day I seek to live in gratitude for His mercy, striving—imperfectly—to love God and love neighbor as He commands.

My primary calling is at home: to love and serve my wife and children as a faithful follower of Jesus. I want them to see a man who prays, listens, repents quickly, and points them to Christ in word and deed. We worship, serve, and laugh together—often around the dinner table in Tewksbury Township, where we’ve lived for 25 years.

Raised in the Catholic Church with 13 years of Catholic schooling, I gained a deep

reverence for Scripture, sacrament, and the global body of Christ. Over time the Lord led me into the Protestant tradition, where I've come to cherish God's sovereignty, Scripture's authority, and the priesthood of all believers. Joining the PC(USA) feels like home—a community that wrestles honestly with hard questions while holding fast to the gospel.

At our congregation I serve as a Ruling Elder, lead the Men's Bible Study, and created/operate our Sunday worship livestream. Beyond the walls, I volunteer with Tres Dias, producing three-day retreats that develop Christian leaders, and join mission trips from Denmark to Haiti.

I'm applying to General Assembly to bring the love and perspective of a husband, father, and small-town elder into the wider church's discernment—listening well, speaking truthfully, and helping shape a Presbyterian future anchored in Christ's love while reaching the next generation with hope.

What excites you or concerns you about G.A.?

I'm thrilled to serve alongside sisters and brothers who know God's love for them and for the world. There is kingdom work to do—worshiping, discerning, and deciding together. The General Assembly traces its roots to 1560 in Scotland, when John Knox and the first elders gathered to shape a Reformed church for the gospel's sake. To stand in that 465-year stream humbles and energizes me.

Yet I'm soberly aware that “our adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour” (1 Peter 5:8). He loves to sow division, distraction, and discouragement—even in holy gatherings. My concern is that we stay vigilant, prayer-soaked, and quick to repent, so Satan cannot derail the Spirit's work. With Christ as Head, I trust we will listen well, love fiercely, and leave Milwaukee more united in mission.

What excites you or concerns you about the church today?

I'm excited by signs of spiritual hunger across America. People—especially the young—are desperately seeking Truth amid chaos. I sense we stand on the verge of a Christ-centered revival, where the gospel's power breaks through apathy and despair. In coffee shops, campuses, and even online, folks ask, “Is there more?” That openness thrills me; it echoes Acts 2, where the Spirit moved in unlikely places.

Yet I'm deeply concerned that "many will come in my name" (Matthew 24:5), peddling a flexible truth that bends to culture rather than bowing to Christ. Some elevate personal experience over Scripture's authority, or embrace a universalism that dilutes the exclusive claim: "I am the way, the truth, and the life" (John 14:6). My prayer is that the PC(USA) stays anchored in the whole counsel of God—gracious, bold, and unashamed of the gospel—so we can shepherd seekers to the real Jesus.
